Parish councils are the most local level of government in England.

- Parish councils represent and work in partnership with local people and Cheshire West and Chester Council. They help to manage the provision of local services and facilities and take decisions that form the policy of the council.
- **Parish councillors are unpaid volunteers.**
Councillors are governed by law & have to abide by the local government code of conduct, Financial Regulations and Standing Orders. Councillors must declare pecuniary and other interests in the parish they serve. Councillors must also declare a personal or prejudicial interest in any matter under discussion at a parish council meeting.
- Town and parish councils are involved in many activities ranging from providing and maintaining local facilities to running events and enhancing the town or village for its residents
- Barnton Parish Council is responsible for playing fields and open spaces, playgrounds, Council buildings and clocks, Barnton Cemetery & Barnton War Memorial.
- The council also owns a Football Ground which is currently leased to Barnton Football Club.
- Town and parish councils are funded by an annual precept which is added to Council Tax collected by Cheshire West and Chester Council
- In the Cheshire West and Chester area there are currently 96 town and parish councils

Barnton Parish Council meets 10 times per year

We aim to improve community well-being, maintain/improve assets in the village, create social opportunities and work with residents on local issues.

The Council manages several assets including: -

- **Runcorn Road Recreation Ground**, aka, 'the secret park' - a well-loved community facility enjoyed by residents and visitors.
- **Nursery Road Recreation Ground** encompasses a children's playground, two football pitches, a basketball court and a skate park. We also hold events at this ground.
- **Townfield Lane Football Ground** is currently leased to Barnton Football Club
- **Barnton War Memorial**, situated at Jubilee Corner on the corner of Townfield Lane, currently being renovated.
- **Barnton Cemetery and Allotments** A well maintained and peaceful cemetery for visitors where burial services are delivered along with two sites of allotment spaces.
- **Council Offices** Council Chambers and meeting rooms based at Barnton Cemetery
- **Community Café** The council runs a **free community café, every Wednesday from 11am**

Cheshire West & Chester Marbury Ward Councillors

Cheshire West Council is the principal authority & has many functions including responsibility for Barnton's roads, footpaths and refuse collections

Other responsibilities include:

- **Education:** Managing schools, admissions, and special educational needs
- **Social Services:** Adult and children's social care
- **Housing:** Oversight of social housing and homelessness services
- **Planning and Building Control:** Approving major planning applications and enforcing building regulations*
- **Transport and Highways:** Road maintenance, street lighting, and public transport coordination
- **Waste Management:** Bin collections, recycling, and waste disposal
- **Environmental Health:** Food safety, noise complaints, and pollution control
- **Council Tax and Benefits:** Collection and administration of local taxes and welfare support
- **Libraries, Leisure, and Culture:** Running public libraries, leisure centres, and cultural events
- ***Barnton Parish Council is a consultee for Cheshire West & Chester Planning Department and considers all planning applications in the village**

Achievements

- Barnton Parish Council have maintained/repaired play equipment at both Nursery Road and Runcorn Road recreation grounds
- The Council are planning the renovation of the War Memorial on Townfield Lane for 2025 (see page 20/21)
- The Council have completed a successful audit for the financial year 2024/25
- The Council have installed new pathways at Barnton Cemetery (see page 19)
- The Council monitor CCTV at Nursery Road Recreation Ground and Barnton Cemetery which has resulted in a reduction in vandalism and anti-social behaviour
- The Council have distributed Grants monies to help community groups in the village and awarded Community Awards to volunteers in the community (see page 9/10)
- The Council have introduced a community space for hire in Barnton Cemetery
- The Council have staged several Events, including the VE Day 80th anniversary celebration held at Nursery Road Recreation Ground, Quiz nights held at Barnton Memorial Hall and an Easter Egg hunt around the village – A Bingo night, Scarecrow Competition and Seniors Christmas Lunch are also in the diary for 2025. - With the aid of volunteers, The Council run a **free Community café held every Wednesday at the Clerk's Office in Barnton Cemetery all year round**
- The Council are working with churches and other groups in the village to promote village events and facilities, providing free access to the community room for their use.
- The Council have installed more granite vaults in the Remembrance Garden of the cemetery to meet popular demand (see page 33)

VE Day 80th Celebrations



Following on from the enormous success of **D-Day 80** - in which we all commemorated the 80th Anniversary of the D-Day landings in Normandy, France, On 8th May this year, We again joined in the celebrations of the 80th Anniversary of **VE Day 80** which marked the end of the war in Europe and WWII as a whole on 8th May 1945, in a similar way.

To celebrate the eighty years of peace and freedom given to us by the bravery and ultimate sacrifice of so many, over one thousand Beacons and several hundred Lamp Lights of Peace were lit at 9.30pm across the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, the Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories on May 8, 2025, with the flames from the Beacons and Lamps representing the 'light of peace' that emerged from the darkness of war.

We were joined again by Northwich Army Cadets, providing the event with a sense of ceremony and pride. Our thanks to all those involved.

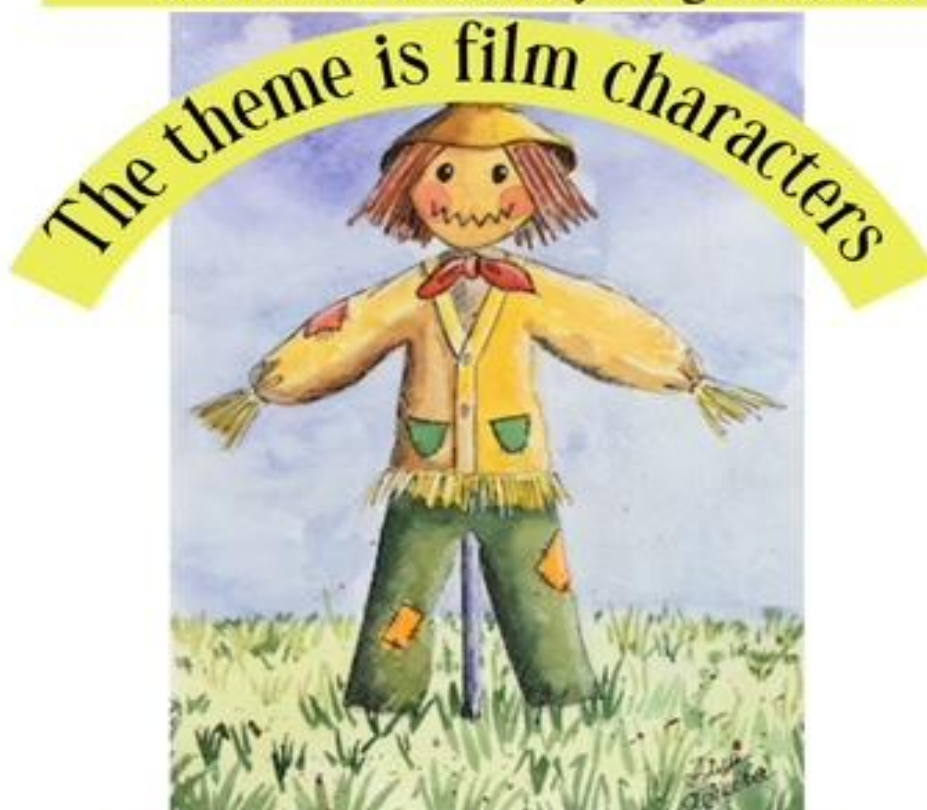

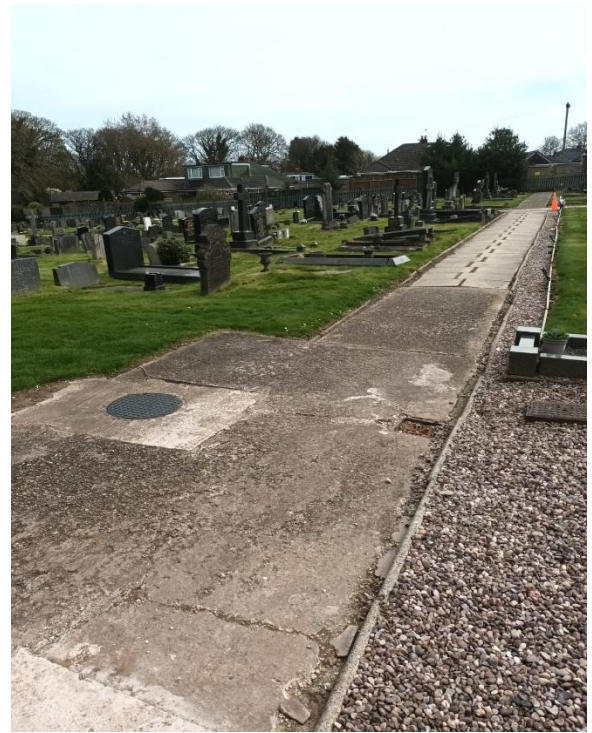

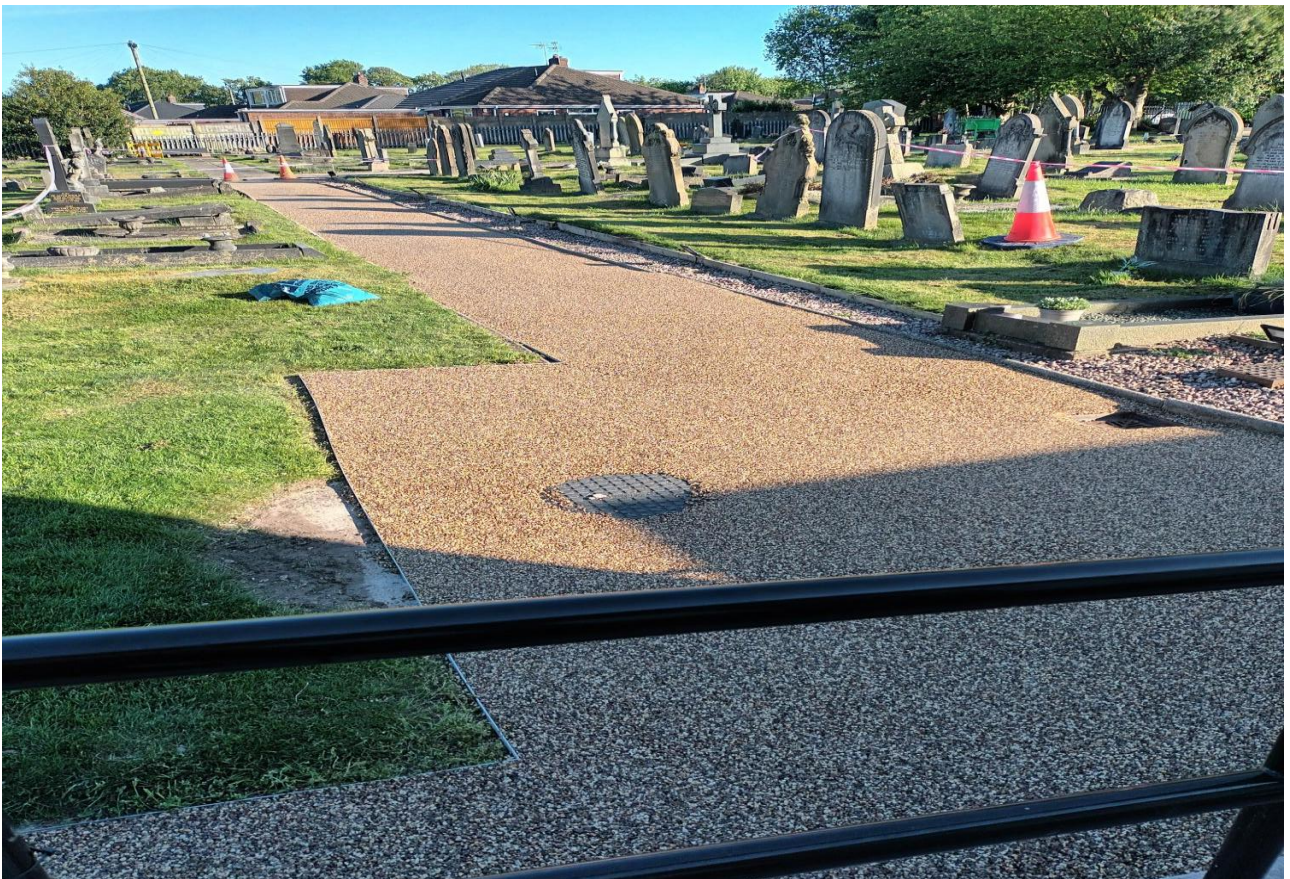


Barnton Cemetery Improvements 2025

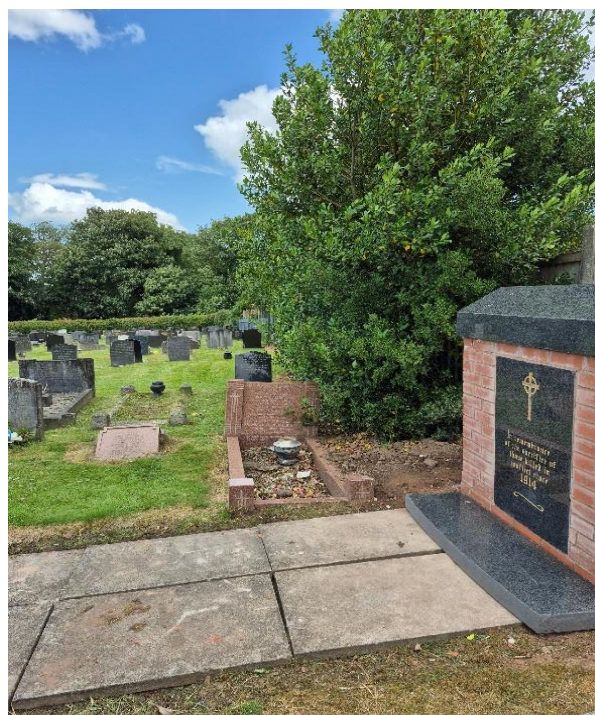


Barnton War Memorial Improvements 2025

Following a public consultation in 2019, Barnton Parish Council approved plans to upgrade the war memorial site to create a lasting and more fitting tribute to service men and women from Barnton who were lost in conflict

This year, we aim to finalise those plans with the installation of a new Cenotaph engraved with the names of all those lost in conflict.

The Original Memorial (pictured below) has been re-sited in the War Grave Section of Barnton Cemetery

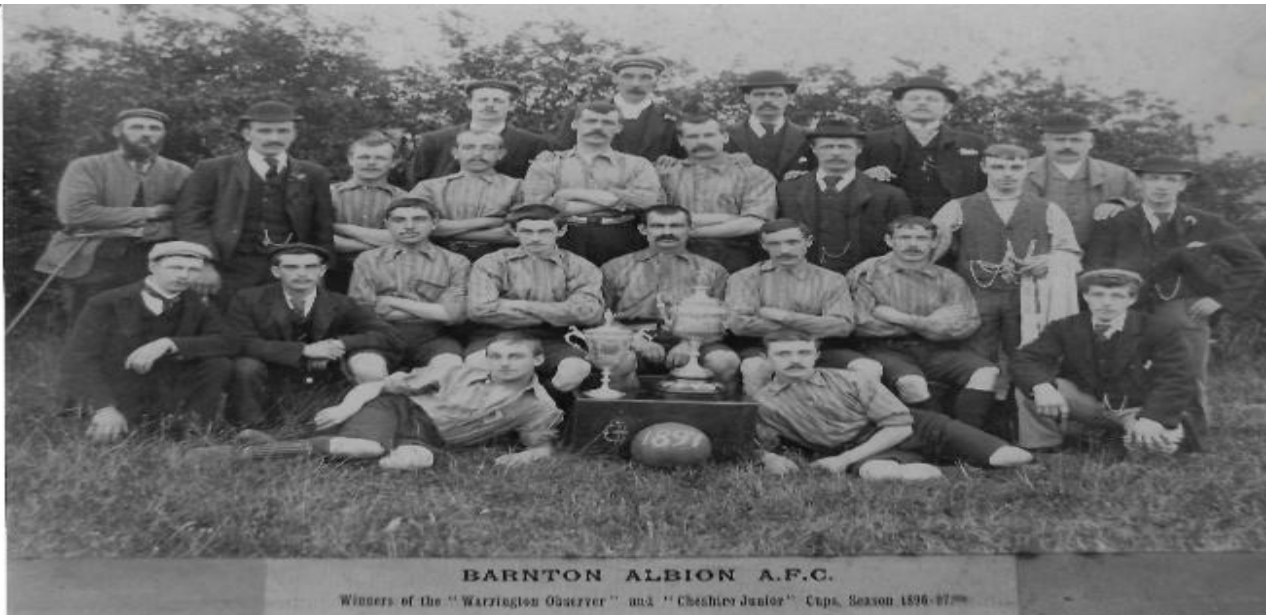

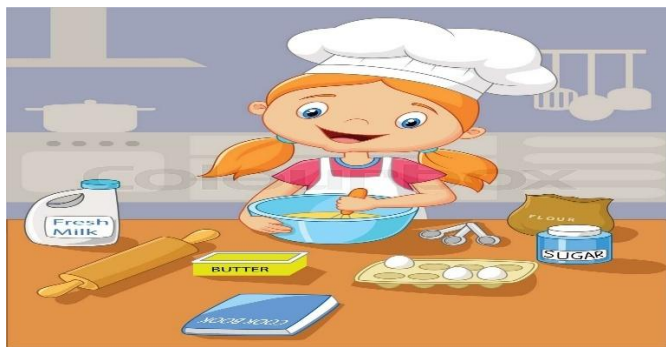

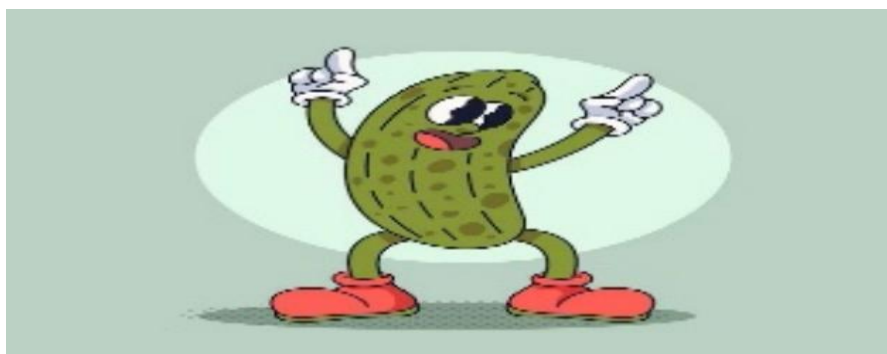

VEHICLE SECURITY GUIDANCE:

WHERE IS YOUR VEHICLE PARKED? Park in well-lit areas. Protect keyless or higher value vehicles by blocking them in or use collapsible bollards.

HAVE YOU REMOVED VALUABLES FROM YOUR VEHICLE? Items should be removed or hidden out of sight, no matter what value to you. Even a few coins can be worth it to a thief.

IS YOUR VEHICLE LOCKED WHEN NOT IN USE? Always lock the vehicle and close windows when the vehicle is unattended.

ARE YOUR KEYS IN A SAFE PLACE? Thieves can retrieve keys through your letterbox. Keep keys out of sight and away from front doors.

Remember, thieves need either the original car keys or access to your keyless signal to steal your vehicle. If this means committing burglary to obtain the keys they will, so make sure you follow the advice on keeping your home safe.

Introducing, GRANITE VAULTS.



Granite Vaults provide a modern alternative to a traditional burial.

Each Vault stores cremated remains (contained in an urn) and can accommodate up to four funerals (urns) during its lifetime

Ownership is the same as owning a traditional grave -
